COMMUNITY ACTIVATION THROUGH SPECIAL EVENTS

Joliet Community Market



The Joliet Community Market was spread out through the month of June in the Downtown City Center. Joliet LEDA was proud to present this event with sponsorships by the City Center Partnership, Giveth, and Unidos Marketing Network. This was LEDA's first event bringing in 30 local food and booth vendors, 23 local musical performances, and 6 local organizations. The Community Market also offered various summer volunteer opportunities for the community.

Joliet Latino Music and Food Festival



Over 3,500 people attended the LEDA's first Joliet Latino Music and Food Festival. The Mexican Consulate was invited to conduct the "Grito de Dolores". The festival hosted 15 food and vendor booths, presented various musical acts, and was headlined by Alacranes Musical. The festival also provided a vaccination clinic through IDPH, voter registration by the Will County Clerk, and various non-profit informational booths. LEDA presented \$10,000 in scholarships for the Hispanic Latino Coalition and raised \$20,000 to go to scholarships for the next year.

Día De Los Muertos



On November 1st, 2021, LEDA partnered with the Joliet Art Movement and Roho Garcia to host El Día de Los Muertos at the Billie Limacher Bicentennial Park. The outdoor event featured Aztec and folkloric dancers, live music, 20+ altars, artists, Joliet's 1st catrin & catrina contest, and Mexican food. Joliet LEDA presented the Hispanic Latino Coalition of Will County with \$10,000 for student scholarships at this event.




ILLINOIS LATINO SMALL BUSINESS PARTNERSHIP

Joliet LEDA presented 307 surveys out of the total 985 businesses surveys in the Illinois Latino Small Business Partnership. Below are LEDA's findings.






